#### Quiet at St Thomas'

This month, St Thomas' PCC talked about how we can make the atmosphere in church more prayerful as people arrive, so we can all prepare ourselves for worship and leave our catching up with friends until after the service. Many people like to pray when they arrive at church, and they may be arriving with much on their mind that they need to bring to God. It's important we all respect this so we are able to prepare in a quiet setting.

This is what the PCC decided:

- Everyone who has a role in leading worship (clergy, lector, cross and book carrier) to arrive at church early enough to have all their tasks completed by 9.50am
- 9.50am the bell will ring and quiet reflective music will play while those leading the worship sit quietly in the choir pews
- 9.58am worship leader party go to the Nellie Raven room to pray and the service starts
- Sidespeople will give out books in the hall rather than in the church itself and use a low voice from 9.50am so everyone is encouraged to enter church quietly.
- After the service, let's make as much noise as we want as we share with each other over a cup of something.

We will be introducing this system from Sunday 1st September

In July, our PCC's discussed the following:

#### St Luke's:

- We agreed in principle to the appointment of a Benefice Administrator and made a decision about recruitment once the budget is finalised
- We adopted Rob Simson as Parish Safeguarding Officer in addition to Rick Newman
- We decided to keep the first and last Sunday in October as Stewardship Sundays
- We adopted a Health and Safety Policy and appointed Rob Simson as Health and Safety Officer
- We voted to proceed with the plan for the new lighting scheme
- We set some financial guidelines for events and PCC spending
- We celebrated receiving a £2,000 grant for a benefice weekend away and a £1,500 grant to launch Friends of St Luke's, both from Southwark Diocese
- We heard about the new Discipleship Plan for our churches

## St Thomas':

- We appointed Helen Jakeways as Chair of the Finance, Buildings and Risk Committee
- We agreed in principle to the appointment of a Benefice Administrator and made a decision about recruitment once the budget is finalised
- We agreed to make applications for grants for a Benefice weekend away and to fund the Enquirer's Course
- We agreed to keep the first and last Sunday in October as Stewardship Sundays
- We decided to introduce a plan to encourage prayerful quietness before the service
- We adopted a Health and Safety Policy and appointed Jeffrey McKinson as Health and Safety Officer
- We heard about the new Discipleship Plan for our churches
- We celebrated receiving a £2,000 grant from RBG to install new gates and notice board
