Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you.'

Christ has died,

Christ is risen,

Christ will come again.

Therefore we proclaim the death that he suffered on the cross; we celebrate his resurrection, his bursting from the tomb;

we rejoice that he reigns at your right hand on high;

and we long for his coming in glory.

As we recall the one, perfect sacrifice of our redemption,

Father, by your Holy Spirit let these gifts of your creation be to us the body and blood of

our Lord Jesus Christ;

form us into the likeness of Christ and make us a perfect offering in your sight.

Look with favour on your people, and in your mercy hear the cry of our hearts.

Bless the earth, heal the sick, let the oppressed go free, and

fill your Church with power from on high.

Gather your people from the ends of the earth to feast with

Luke and Richard, Thomas and all your saints at the table in your kingdom, where the new creation is brought to perfection in Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
