The Gathering

President In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
All **Amen.**

The Greeting

President Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you
All **and also with you.**

Introduction

President Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, during Lent we have been preparing by works of love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and Resurrection. Today we come together to begin this solemn celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that, united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

The people hold up palms or branches while the following prayer is said.

President God our Saviour, whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as Messiah to suffer and to die, let these palms be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
All **Amen.**

The palms are blessed with holy water.

The Palm Gospel

Luke 19.28–40

Minister of the Word Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.
All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Minister of the Word When Jesus had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here.

If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' They said, 'The Lord needs it.' Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it.

As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!'

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'

The Procession

President Let us go forth, praising Jesus our Messiah.

We process to church, holding our palms aloft and singing a hymn. On arrival in church, the palm crosses of worshippers there are blessed.

The Collect

After the procession, when all are in their places, the president introduces a period of silent prayer with the words

Let us pray for a closer union with Christ in his suffering and in his glory.

Silence is kept.

President True and humble king, hailed by the crowd as Messiah:
grant us the faith to know you and love you, that we may be
found beside you on the way of the cross, which is the path of
glory.

Liturgy of the Word

Old Testament Reading – read by Peter

PETER – A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The Lord God has given me
the tongue of a teacher,
that I may know how to sustain
the weary with a word.
Morning by morning he wakens—
wakens my ear
to listen as those who are taught.
The Lord God has opened my ear,
and I was not rebellious,
I did not turn backwards.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.
